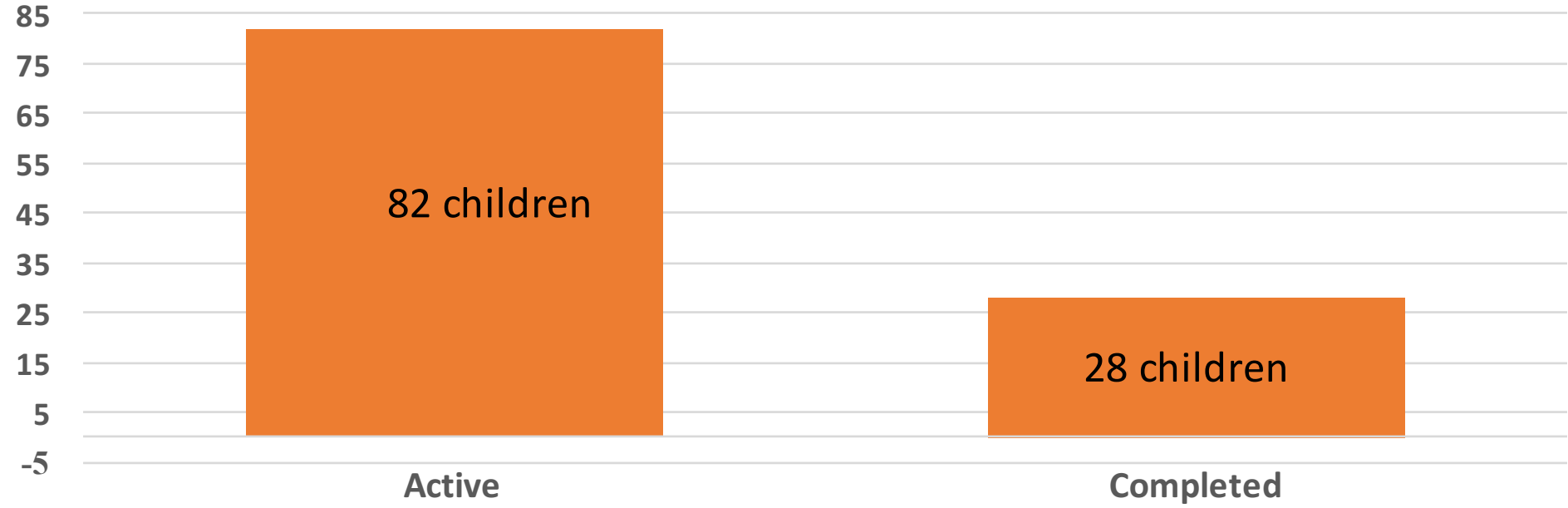

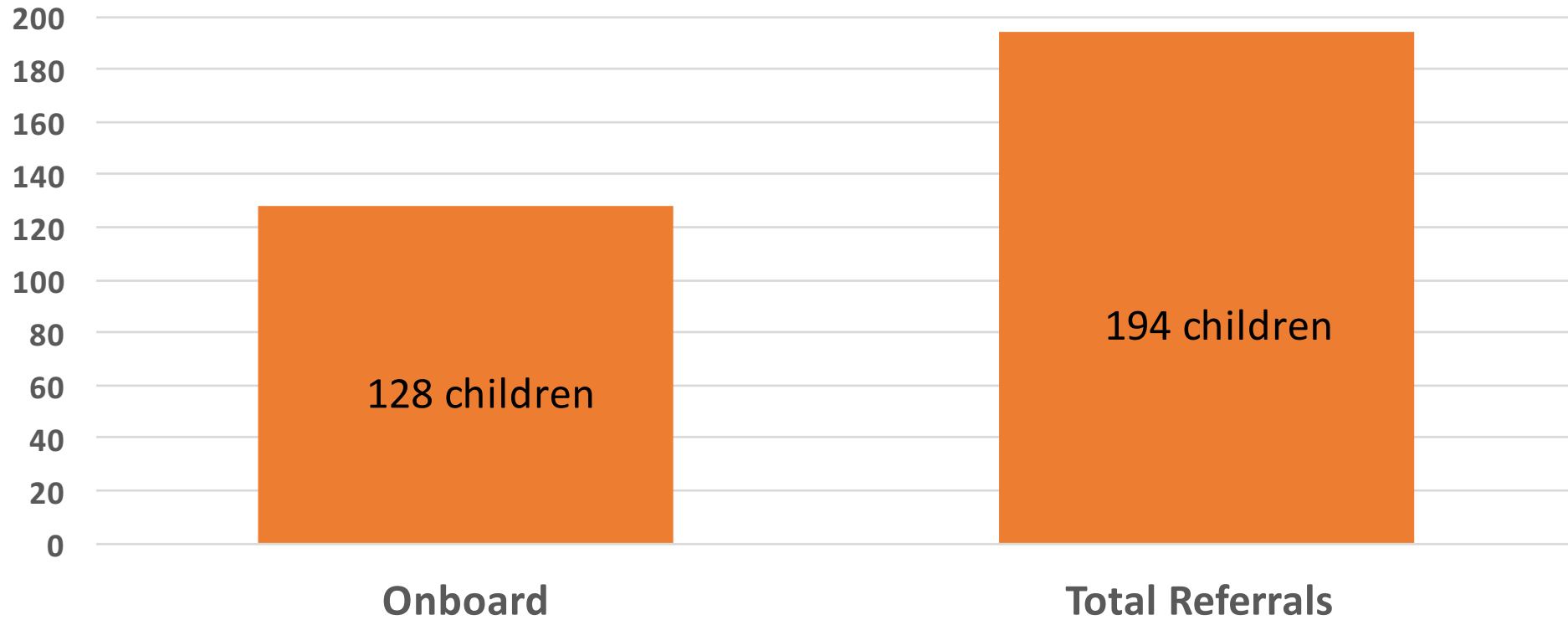
Number of Children

New Life Stories measures the effectiveness of its program through a robust combination of a weekly monitoring and bi-yearly evaluation measurements.

- Quantitative Measurements
 - 4 short questionnaire completed by Learning Friends weekly
- Qualitative Measurements
 - 20 open-ended survey plus counsellor's observation done by counsellor bi-yearly

Program Outcomes



Overall, the children and mothers have made progress in particular in terms of behavioral and mindset change.

The Program Outcomes is the heart of New Life Stories therefore substantial focus and almost all of our effort have been placed to ensure we meet the Outcome Indicators of our programs.

Program Outcomes



Client Outcome 1

Out of 100 children in the Early Reader programme, 70 (70%) showed showed significant reduction in trauma associated with having an incarcerated mother and/or significant increase in self-confidence and self-esteem.

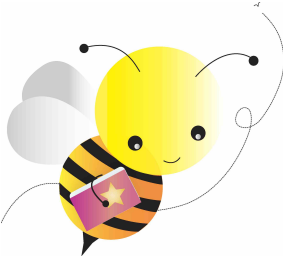

Projek baca buku kanak-kanak memerlukan harus dipergiat

SEMASA Nur Ghaziyah Mohd Amin di darjah dua, dia tidak dapat bertutur dan membaca bahasa Inggeris dengan lancar. Tetapi kini pada usia 12 tahun, dia bukan sahaja fasih namun prestasinya di sekolah semakin meningkat. Ini dengan bantuan Program Pembaca Awal anjuran pertubuhan tidak meraih keuntungan, New Life Stories - usaha membantu kanak-kanak yang ibu mereka dalam tahapan atau pemuliharaan agar kanak-kanak itu menjadi yakin dan bersedia ke sekolah menerusi program membaca. Para sukarelawan kamarnya akan ke rumah kanak-kanak yang dipilih untuk membaca dengan mereka. Ia adalah antara inisiatif pertubuhan itu dalam menyokong pendidikan pra-sekolah bagi golongan kanak-kanak yang ibu mereka dalam penjara atau tahapan. Berentak selepas mengendalikannya semasa bersama sekitar 40 kanak-kanak di Dar Tambines Hub (DTH) semalam, Setiausaha

Parlimen Kanan (Elwal Dalam Negeri menungkuh Kesultanan), Enck Amrin berkata program itu penting bagi mengukuhkan masalah seperti dadah, merebak ke generasi seterusnya dalam sebuah keluarga. "Paling kurang, kita harus mengkaji mereka dengan kemahiran membaca dan mempunyai rasa cinta terhadap buku. "Membaca buku juga satu cara buat mereka hilang rasa rindu kepada ibu bapa, kerisuan dan rasa keseronokan. "Ia juga adalah satu jendala bagi mereka melihat dunia luar lebih luas dan ia satu cara mereka untuk masalah," ujarnya. Menerusi membaca, Enck Amrin berharap kanak-kanak itu dapat melihat bermacam peluang yang ada dan mendorong mereka berentak positif serta tidak tertampan kepada kesempatan hidup. Dalam pada itu, Enck Amrin mengesahkan agar program sumpamanya itu dipergiat. "Usaha seperti ini harus dirakkan dan sokongan perlu dihuraikan kepada anak-anak, anggota keluarga seperti nenek, yang menjaga anak sewaktu ibu bapa tiada. Ini penting dan perlu ditamatkan. Jika kita sama-sama bantu, berat sama dijinjing agar ia lebih ringan."

"Ini penting dan perlu ditamatkan. Jika kita sama-sama bantu, berat sama dijinjing agar ia lebih ringan. "Saya juga bangga melihat perubahan seperti New Life, masyarakat kita bergandeng bahu dengan masyarakat lain memberi bantuan kepada mereka tanpa mengira latar belakang," terangnya. Sementara itu, Nur Chaahyah amat menghargai bantuan yang diterima menerusi program itu, hinggan dia kini mampu mendapat gred B yang tinggi bagi mata pelajaran Bahasa Inggeris. "Begitu banyak manfaat yang saya raih daripada program ini. Saya mahu ingat lagi, semasa saya mada program ini pada darjah dua,

saya tidak boleh bertutur atau baca buku leggers. "Tetapi selepas itu, saya belajar dan berjaya kuasai bahasa ini. "Kini saya mahu sumbang sesuatu dan telah menjadi sukarelawan bagi program New Life untuk menolong kanak-kanak lain seperti saya," ujar anak ketiga dalam empat beradik. Bunyia, Cik Salimah Sakar, 53 tahun, yang dibebaskan daripada penjara kerana kesalihan berkaitan dadah pada 2015, bersyukur dengan bantuan diberikan kepada anak-anaknya. "Ia memberi keluarga kami harapan dan menjadikan anak saya, dharunya pendam dan pemalu, lebih berkeyakinan diri," terangnya.

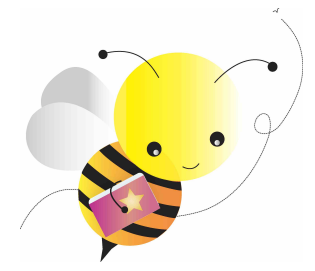
RESPONS PELAN INDUK PENGANGKUTAN DARAT 2040

Ramai pilih jalan kaki, berbasikal atau naiki pengangkutan awam

MENYEDIAKAN laluan yang mudah, pantas dan terhubung agar mudah orang ramai berjalan kaki, berbasikal dan naiki pengangkutan awam. Demikian antara saranan yang diterima Pengarah Pengangkutan Darat (LTA) melalui respons daripada masyarakat awam berkaitan Pelan Induk Pengangkutan Darat (LTMP) 2040. Lebih 5,000 respons diterima daripada individu pelbagai usia dan latar belakang melalui wadah berbeza termasuk perbincangan kumpulan fokus dan tinjauan dalam talian sejak ia dimulakan Ogos lalu, menurut LTA dalam satu kemuncakannya semalam. Menteri Negara Kanan (Pengangkutan menungkuh Perhubungan dan Penerangan), Dr Jamil Puthucheary, berkata respons yang dibentarkan kesan besar terhadap perancangan bagi pelan pengangkutan tersebut. Dr Jamil, yang juga pensuaran LTMP menaiki perhatian bahawa dua pertiga daripada mereka yang memberi maklum balas lebih menyokong pelaksanaan tanpa penilikan kenderaan, contohnya mereka lebih suka berjalan, menaiki basikal, menaiki skuter dan menggunakan kereta dalam keadaan berbeza dari satu tempat ke satu seperti kenderaan yang dikongsi dan diwaja. "Maklum balas yang kami terima mengenai perubahan terhadap sistem pengangkutan awam yang lebih membantu ialah aspek penghubungannya, keselamatan, kecekapan, selain memastikan cara manusia berfikir - ini semua memberi kesan besar kepada pelan induk kami," kata beliau yang dilapor akhbar The Straits Times (ST) semalam. Beliau mengongsi respons masyarakat awam yang dipaparkan dalam "Rakayat Singapura inginkan sistem pengangkutan darat yang memulakan akses untuk bekerja, belajar dan bermain," kata beliau di sesi ketujuh Late-ning Live LTMP 2040 di Waterway Point pada semalam.

Respons dan saranan yang diterima merangkumi tiga tema utama; untuk mengukuhkan laluan ramai memulihkan untuk berjalan kaki, berbasikal dan naiki pengangkutan awam (Walk, Cycle Ride-WCR), mewujudkan pengangkutan WCR lebih inklusif dan mudah, serta saranan bagaimana sistem pengangkutan darat boleh meningkatkan mutu hidup. Di bawah tema mengukuhkan WCR, 75 peratus responden tinjauan dalam talian memilih "kemudahan" sebagai ciri utama sistem pengangkutan darat. Ini diikuti ciri "penyambungan" bagi perjalanan satu sebanyak 63 peratus, dan aspek "kecekapan" sebanyak 59 peratus. Dalam sesi perbincangan kumpulan fokus, peserta menyuarakan pendapat bahawa pemilikan WCR bergantung pada masa perjalanan yang tidak melebihi satu jam. Bagi mewujudkan pengalaman WCR lebih inklusif, budaya penyayang di antara pengguna harus dipupuk. Antara langkah yang disarankan masyarakat awam adalah memberi pengiktirafan dan ganjaran kepada penumpang yang berbudhi baik. Ada juga yang mengukuhkan pengangkutan awam menjalini latihan bagi memperkukuhkan cara membantu penumpang keperluan khas. Mutu kehidupan akan lebih selamat dan menyenangkan jika ruang khusus bagi WCR disediakan, kata dua pertiga responden koji soal selidik dan dokumen perundingan awam. Selain kereta, lebih keutamaan dan ruang patut diberi kepada pejalan kaki, penunggang basikal, dan pengguna alat berpindah (PMD). Ini termasuk menyediakan laluan bersama lebih selamat dan mengagalkan laluan di kalangan orang ramai.
